## REPORT FOR INDIAN FOUNDATION OF QUALITY MANAGEMENT EVENT

Indian Foundation of Quality Management Event was conducted by TVS Motors on 18th April 2024, in the TVS Institute for Quality and Leadership, Thattanahalli where the different community development initiatives undertaken by Srinivasan Services Trust (CSR wing of TVS ) were showcased to MDs and CEOs of close to 50 MNCS.

Dr. Anisha Rao, Faculty, Dr. Kruth Ravindra, Dr. Nikhila K, and Dr. Niyati Rao A N, 1st-year postgraduates, Department of Pediatric and Preventive Dentistry, attended the program.



The program started at 9:00 am with an inaugural speech by Mr. Swaran Singh, Chairman, of Srinivasan Services Trust regarding the community development initiatives undertaken by TVS.

It was followed by a display of the models of their CSR. A model of our school oral health program was showcased as one of their best practices during this event and a presentation was given to the delegates by our Faculty and Post Graduate students. During the presentation, the background of the initiative was briefed upon. Following this, the facilities available in the camp set up like the mobile dental clinic, table top airrotor units and scaler units were discussed. The delegates were informed about the procedure of our camps which included collection of consent forms, screening of the children, preventive and restorative procedures performed and the strict adherence to infection control and biomedical waste management guidelines during and after the camp. The statistical impact of the dental camps conducted during the academic year of 2023-24 were also shed light on during this presentation. The event concluded with refreshments.



**Impact**

Screenings and Procedures: 259 children received screenings, leading to 292 procedures, including fillings, sealants, and scaling, effectively addressing dental issues and promoting oral health.

Financial Relief for Parents: Parents saved Rs. 500 per child through the initiative.

Promotion of Lasting Oral Health: Preventive measures aimed to reduce future dental problems, promoting lasting oral health and wellbeing among children.

**Background**

In Hosur, 551 identified widespread dental hygiene issues among children during hygiene programs, indicating poor oral health practices.

Financial difficulties and limited access to dental hospitals compounded the problem, hindering families' ability to seek necessary oral healthcare.
