
The detailed reports of the workshops are attached along with the relevant photographs. We once again thank you for your constant support for the activities of the Health Professional Education Unit.

Chief Guest on the dais

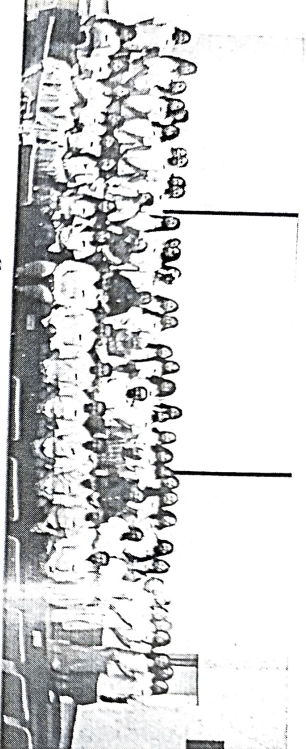


Distribution of White coats

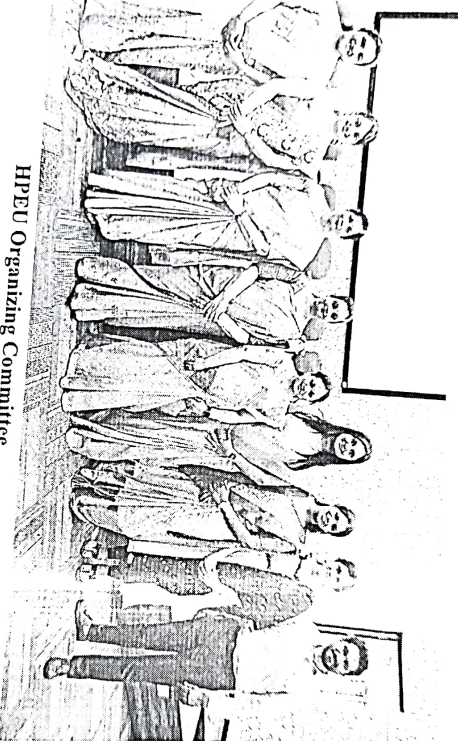

At the outset, we would like to thank you for providing us the opportunity to continue with the Infection Control and patient safety workshop as a part of the Jagriti – Foundational Course for clinical care conducted for the Third BDS students during 27th, 29th & 31st January 2024.

A brief outline of Infection control practices talk was given to 3rd BDS students on 27th January by Dr. Bharathi M.B, Head, HICC.

The workshop was conducted during the morning session (9:00 am to 1:00 pm) of 29th January 2024 and 31st January 2024. The entire Hospital Infection Control Committee worked as a team to make the workshop a success.

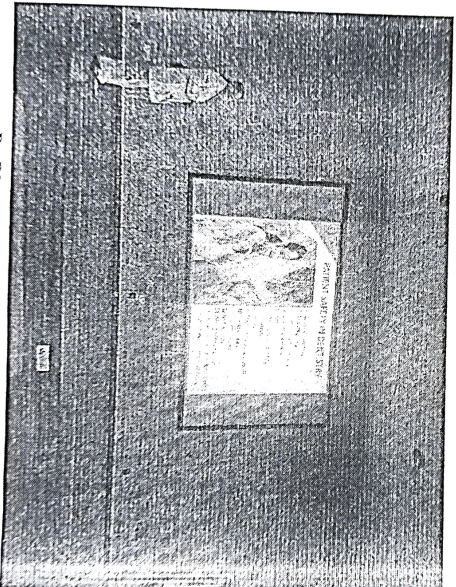
The workshop started with opening note on Infection control practices is important in dentistry by Dr. Deepi Vadavi to orient the students. This was followed by a series of activities conducted by all members of the infection control committee (Dr. Seema Patil, Dr. Archana, Dr. Deepi, Dr. Sudheer, Dr. Vinodhini, Dr. Sahana Ms. Kavyashree, Dr. Navya, Dr. Gouri, Dr. Suman) wherein a brief lecture was given by the respective resource person followed by providing students with various hypothetical situations and hands on experience on several aspects of infection control and patient safety. Activities covered included sterilization and disinfection, PPE donning and doffing, hand hygiene, measures to be followed during needle prick and hazardous material spillage, blood spillage and biomedical waste management.

The students enjoyed the workshop with active participation. The feedback report and photographs are attached.

Student Feedback Summary

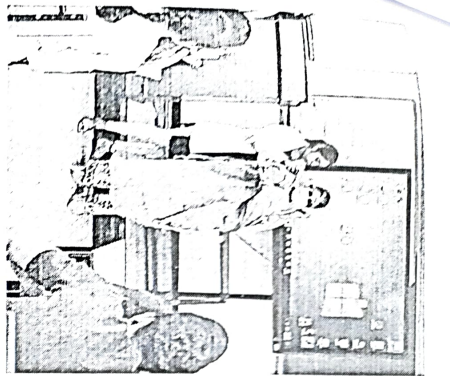
1. 66% of the students have rated the session 10/10, and 26.7% rated it 9/10 indicating that it was very helpful.

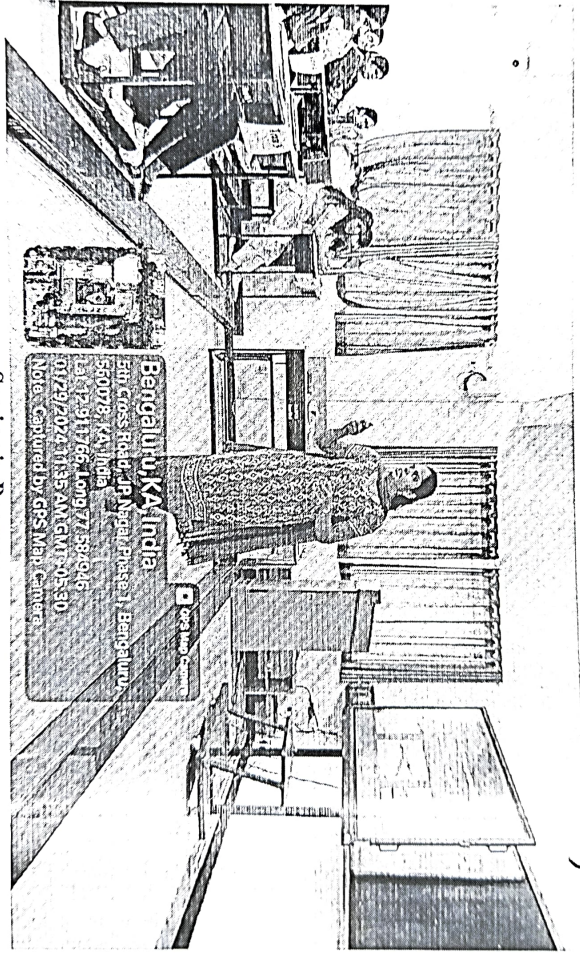

The Communication skills workshop has been running as a part of the Jagruti – Foundational Course for Clinical Care for the 7th Year now. This workshop was an outcome of the FAIMER project of Dr. Jyotsna S in 2015-16. Subsequently the communication skills workshop was initiated in 2016. Mr. Raghohama Rao who is a Master trainer in soft skill development has been running the workshop as the Resource Person for this workshop for UG and PG students successfully. The HPEU co-ordinators for this year's workshop were Dr. Anisha and Dr. Sahana.

On 1st Feb 2024, the workshop was held for the 7th year in succession.

The third-year undergraduate students and first-year postgraduate students were trained in the critical aspects of effective doctor-patient communication over a two-hour period. The training session involved discussion and hands-on activities to elaborate on the points effectively.

Student Feedback on the workshop:

1. 81.8% of the students have rated the session 10/10, and 9% rated it 9/10 indicating that it was very helpful.
2. The key factors which facilitated the learning process were:
 - a. Activities and interactions
 - b. Presentation
 - c. Sir's Communication Skills
3. When students were asked to enumerated factors which hindered their learning, they indicated that there were NO hindering factors.
4. The key learning that students wish to utilize in their clinical training were:
 - a. The way they interact with their patients
 - b. Empathy
 - c. Patience & understanding
 - d. Sandwich technique
 - e. Overall communication skills

Report on Prescription Writing Workshop
27th January – 1st February 2024

The Prescription Writing Workshop was planned as a part of “Jagrithi – Foundational Workshop for Clinical Care”. The idea was a brainchild of Dr. Jyotsna, taken forward by Dr. Deepthi Vadavi and the resource people were Dr. Deepak S, Dr. Sahana M S and Dr. Subhash B V and Dr Priyanka T S being the Co-ordinator for the same.

A manual and pre-recorded video was prepared including all components intended to be covered in the workshop and was sent to the students prior to the workshop. A newspaper article on antibiotic resistance was also sent to the patients. 10 case scenarios were designed to present the students with real life situations. The students were divided into 10 groups. They had to write prescriptions and a self-appointed group leader had to present the same. The resource person then discussed the nuances in prescription writing.

Student Feedback showed:

1. Almost all of the students rated the useful of the program as a 10, with 1 being least useful and 10 being most useful.
2. In answer to the question on what about the module impressed them, they said:
 - a. The Practical implications of Pharmacology knowledge.
 - b. Instructions on the correct dosages of the drugs
 - c. Factors which affect the drugs prescribed in different situations.
 - d. Interactive and Thought-provoking sessions based on case scenarios.
 - e. Intense Knowledge received.
3. To the question on what was learnt which was application based, they answered:
 - a. Clinical application of Pharmacology.
 - b. Format of prescription writing.
 - c. Do's and don'ts while prescribing various medications.
 - d. What to prescribe pre-operatively, post-operatively and in an emergency.
 - e. Indications, contra-indications, precautions and dosing of drugs.
 - f. Drug synergisms and antagonisms.
 - g. Special needs of patients and Analyzing the situations.
 - h. How to give instructions to the patient and Hierarchy of prescribing drugs.
 - i. Emergency drugs, dosages and handling such emergency situations effectively.

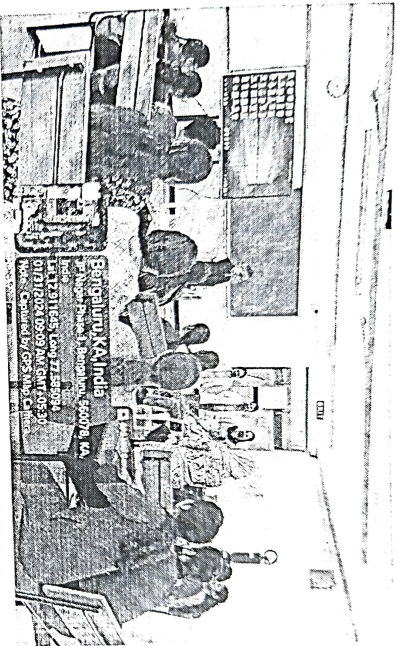

The session was conducted in two batches of 28 and 29 students each, for 4 hours. The workshop encompassed the concept of Ethics, history, Belmont's principles. Professional competencies and stressed upon the need and use of ethics for dental professionals. The workshop included interactive presentation, small group activities, brain-storming, buzz groups discussions, pair and share and plenary sessions. It was designed to stimulate introspection, discussion and sharing of ideas. Special guests accompanied the resource person on both days of the workshop, who also participated in the activities and provided some insights to the students through their experience. A feedback was obtained from the students at the end of activity 1 and at the end of the workshop.

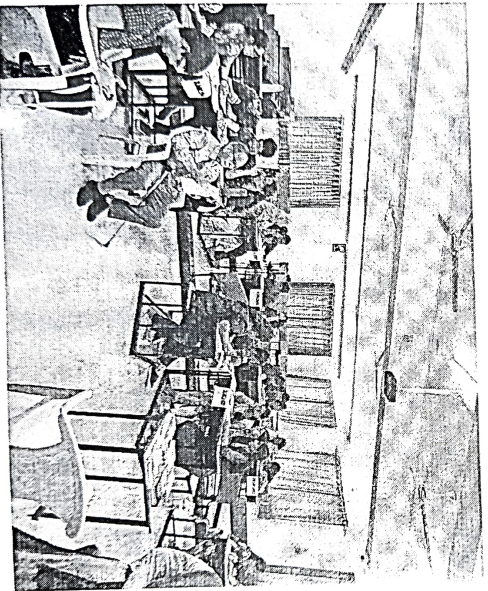
Student feedback about the workshop:

1. 68.6% of the students have rated the session 10/10, and 22.9% rated it 9/10 indicating that it was very helpful.
2. The key factors which facilitated the learning process were:
 - a. Activities and interactive sessions
 - b. Presentation and group activity
 - c. Way the speaker encouraged us
 - d. Importance of ethics, equity and being humane
 - e. How to face ethical dilemma
 - f. Sir's enthusiasm and energy
 - g. this session was very different from other classes and very refreshing.

- When students were asked to enumerate factors which hindered their learning, they indicated that there were NO hindering factors.
- Students were asked if they can apply the information obtained through the workshop in their clinical training and 85.7% rate S/S, and remaining 14.3% rated 4/5, indicating that they agreed strongly.

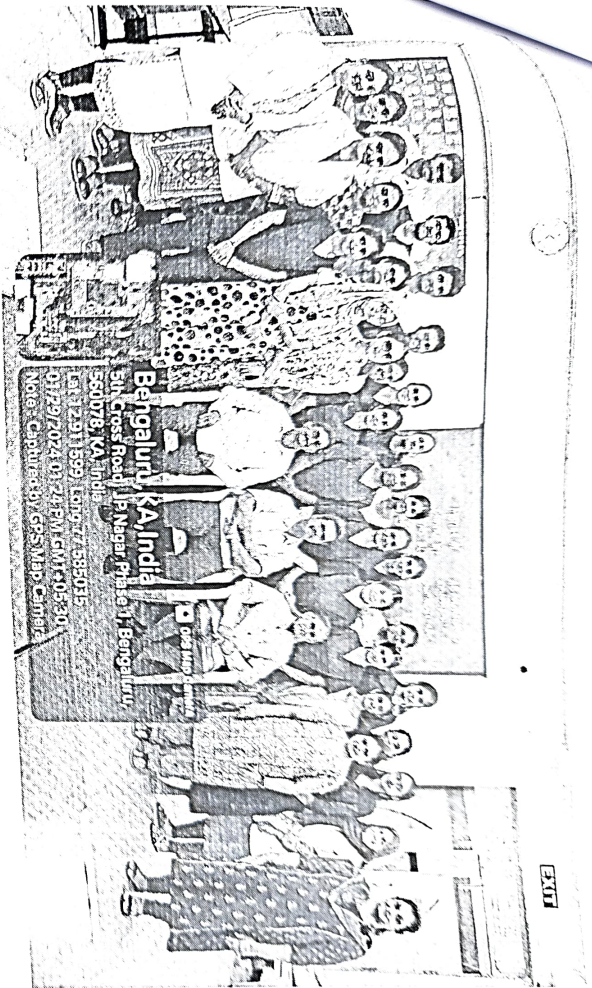
