Sub: Report on Jagrithi - Foundational Course for Clinical care 2022 (February 21 pt 10 24th 2022)

Respected Madam,

The program "Jagrithi - Foundational Course for Clinical care" was conducted from February 21st to 24th, 2022 followed by the White coat ceremony on 25.2.22. At the outset, we thank you for supporting the initiatives of the Health Professional Education Unit. A total of 60 UG students and 25 PG students benefited from the workshop.

The Jagrithi - Foundational course for clinical care is a student capacity building program, which has evolved from the "Patient safety and communication skills workshop" which was conducted during the period 2016-21. "Jagrithi" has taken the best of the previous workshops on Communication skills, ethics and professionalism, empathy and infection control practices and added two additional training programs "Humanities" and "prescription writing workshops".

The workshops were designed systematically using Kern's 6 steps of curriculum development which focused on needs assessment, setting objectives, designing, implementing and evaluating the sessions for further improvement. The 6 workshops were conducted for 20 hours spread over 3.5 days from the 21st of March to the 24th of February 2022. The goal of the foundational course was to instil the values of ethics , professionalism, empathy and humanities in our students as they entered the clinical program. The course focused on developing the communication skills and improve the doctor-patient interaction through the communication skills workshop. The importance of sterilisation and disinfection and prescribing medication diligently was brought in through the two workshops devoted for training in clinical management. The program evaluation feedbacks, informal discussions indicate that the workshops have been greatly successful in meeting the goals.

In addition, a 5 year impact assessment was undertaken to evaluate the patient safety and communication skills workshop. This impact assessment was taken earlier at the end of 3 year period (2019) and now at the end of 5 year period (2022). Both the assessments have demonstrated self reported behavioural change among students who have participated in this training program, thus indicating high utility and value addition to the students and institution. The detailed reports of the 6 workshops and the impact assessment report is attached for your kind perusal. Once again, we thank you for providing the necessary support to undertake this program for the 6th year in succession.
